### **NEW LIFE FOR WAR MEMORIALS ACROSS NSW**

Minister for Citizenship and Communities Victor Dominello has announced a new round of grant recipients under the NSW Community War Memorials Fund.

Mr Dominello said 12 war memorials in towns and suburbs across NSW will be upgraded and maintained, thanks to more than \$84,000 in NSW Government funding.

The Community War Memorials Fund was established to help protect and restore war memorials across NSW and grant applications are open twice a year.

“As we move toward the start of the Centenary of Anzac (2014-2018), it is more important than ever that we ensure our community war memorials stand proud and strong around the state,” Mr Dominello said.

“These 12 unique monuments to the brave servicemen and women that sacrificed their lives help us to remember their selfless contribution to our country.

“I believe we have a responsibility to preserve and rejuvenate these war memorials as a means of demonstrating that their sacrifices have not, and will not, be forgotten,” Mr Dominello said.

\$5,045 has been granted to replace the honour roll and names of the fallen on the Ulmarra and District War Memorial while \$10,000 has been allocated to replace broken tiles and stop vandalism at the Woodward Park Memorial in Heathcote.

“Last week I visited the Ulmarra Cenotaph with the Member for Clarence Chris Gulaptis MP and can attest to the high esteem in which the monument is held in the local community,” Mr Dominello said.

“I encourage any community which needs funding for their local memorial to consider making a submission under this program during the second round of grants later this year,” Mr Dominello said.

Grant applications are considered by a State War Memorials Committee, comprising representatives of the NSW RSL, NSW Government Architect’s Office and NSW Veterans’ Affairs (Office of Communities).

Applications must be for the repair or conservation of a war memorial commemorating Australia’s military heritage and located within the State of New South Wales or of direct and substantial relevance to the State.
